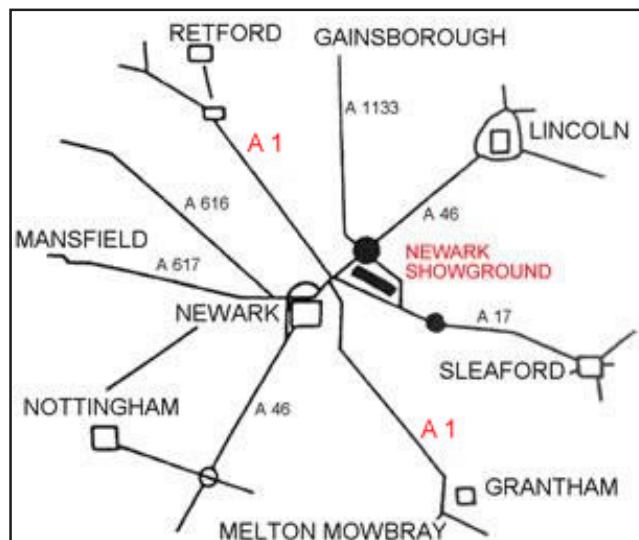

## DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

1. In the following definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.
2. Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.
3. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.
4. In estimating the number of awards won all wins up to & including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **26th March 2012**
5. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First prize does not include a Special prize of whatever value.
6. If an exhibitor reports before judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-
  1. Withdrawal - the dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) & 20.
  2. Transfer - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of their being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy & Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.  
b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months or 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.  
c) For any reason other than above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
7. If an exhibit arrives late & misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may NOT be transferred to any other class.

- MINOR PUPPY:** For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
- PUPPY:** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
- JUNIOR:** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
- YEARLING:** For dogs of **twelve** and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the show.
- BEGINNERS:** For owner, handler or exhibit not having won a first prize at a Championship or Open Show
- NOVICE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First prizes at Open or Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy & Special Puppy Classes excepted whether restricted or not.)
- POSTGRADUATE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.
- LIMIT:** For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won seven or more first prizes in all at Open & Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not.
- OPEN:** For all dogs of the Breed for which the class is provided and which are eligible for entry at the Show.
- VETERAN:** For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show.
- SPECIAL OPEN**  
**LONG HAIRD:**  
**SPEC FIELD TRIAL:** For dogs which have won an award in actual competition at a Field Trial held under Kennel Club or Irish Kennel Club Field Trial regulations (does NOT include the Show Gundog Working Certificate or Guns Award) OR have been graded at a Spring pointing test.

## Definitions Contd.

### SPECWORKING:

For dogs which have won an award in competition at a Kennel Club licenced Working Trial held under Kennel Club Regulations I OR have been placed 1st to 10th at a Kennel Club licenced Obedience Test held under Kennel Club Regulations G OR have been awarded a place rosette at Kennel Club licenced Agility Test held under kennel Club Regulations H.

### SPEC GAME KEEPERS:

Confined to dogs who attend as members of the regular picking-up or beating team. *Written notification of their working activity is required from the Gamekeeper and/or Head of Syndicate for entry into this Class (please include this with your entry form)*

### BRACE:

For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class, other than brace or team.

**JUNIOR HANDLING CLASSES:** Entries to be made on the entry form-put class number next to dog and enter Junior Handler's details in box provided. *Dogs MUST be entered and exhibited in another class at this Show.*

### NFC:

Societies may at their discretion, accept Not For Competition entries, Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed. Kennel Club registered dogs will be accepted NFC for a fee of £3.00 per dog. **All dogs accepted NFC must be 4 calendar months or over and KC registered. Full KC details must be given on the entry form.**

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.



## CHILDREN AT THE SHOW



Any children attending the Show are the sole responsibility of the Parent/Guardian accompanying them. They must be kept under control at all times and the Weimaraner Association will not accept responsibility for injury, damage, etc, however caused.

## EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE

Any owner/exhibitor/handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by dog/s within the environs of the Show

## SPECIAL NOTICE

In accordance with Kennel Club Regulations, NO puppies under 6 months of age are allowed on the Showground (including the Car Park), however, puppies between 4 - 6 months of age may be entered Not For Competition - please provide all details on the entry form. NO Spectator's Dogs will be allowed into the Show unless entered Not For Competition.



## ~ SOFT CAGES ~

The Kennel Club requests that all dogs in soft cages are NOT left unattended at any time, for safety reasons.

## RULES & REGULATIONS

1. OPENING OF SHOW: The Show will open at 9.00am.
2. ARRIVAL OF DOGS: Dogs will be received at any time but it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. JUDGING TIME: Judging will commence at 10.00am.
4. REMOVAL OF DOGS: Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. Exhibits may not be removed any earlier unless by written order of the Veterinary Surgeon, Veterinary Practitioner or of the Show Management then only in very exceptional and unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to The Kennel Club. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed by which time dogs must be removed.
5. COOKING STOVES: The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. ENTRY FEES: Each exhibit, Members £14.00 for the first class subsequent entries £11.50. Non-Members £18.00 for the first class subsequent entries £11.50, Junior Handling Class £11.00, Dogs entered NFC £3.00. If an exhibitor presents an incorrectly completed or dishonoured cheque in respect of show entries the incurred Bank charges and any handling fees will be passed on to the exhibitor concerned. No monies will be refunded if unforeseen circumstances cause the Show to be cancelled.
7. PRIZE MONEY: No prize money will be awarded. Rosettes awarded to fifth place in all classes, BIS, RBIS, Best Puppy & Best Veteran in Show. Trophies: Only fully paid up members of the Association may take trophies from the Show.
8. REFUSAL OF ENTRIES: The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries or advertisements.
9. PUPPIES: Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition. (ie born after 6th November 2011).
10. MATING OF BITCHES: The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
11. BEST PUPPY IN SHOW: Where a Best Puppy in Show is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed & is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six & not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.  
Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.  
WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION: Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than Breed Classes prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.  
PROVISO: For the Purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace & Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
12. BEST IN SHOW: The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed & is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.  
WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION: Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than Breed Classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show & Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.  
PROVISO: For the Purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace & Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of 10 minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

## RULES & REG Contd.

14. REGULATIONS: No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the canine press wherever possible.
15. PREPARATION FOR EXHIBITION: All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F Annex B - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition
16. OVERSEAS EXHIBITS: All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
17. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
  - 1) When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
  - 2) If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
  - 3) The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
  - 4) Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
  - 5) When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
  - 6) Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so you dog stays well hydrated.
  - 7) Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. In accordance with the guide lines recommended by The Kennel Club, the Committee gives notice that remedial action will be taken in the event of any dog/s left in cars who appear to be in a distressed condition. Entries may be refused for future shows from any exhibitor where remedial action has been taken.
18. NOT FOR COMPETITION: Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered
19. REGULATIONS: The Show will be held under the rules and regulations of The Kennel Club. Wherever the word dog appears in these rules this refers to both dog and bitch unless otherwise stated. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the canine press wherever possible. The secretary must immediately report in writing to the secretary of The Kennel Club any fraudulent or discreditable conduct at shows.
20. REGULATIONS F- F9 EXHIBITION OF DOGS: No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time whilst at the licensed venue including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.
21. DOG FOULING: Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog/s and also any grooming waste at any Kennel Club Licenced Show within the licenced venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
22. JUDGES: If any judge is unable to fulfil an engagement, the Weimaraner Association Committee reserve the right to appoint a replacement. In these circumstances exhibitors may withdraw from competition but no entry fees will be refunded.
23. RESPONSIBILITY: The Officers & Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of the dogs brought for exhibition, but it must be distinctly understood by exhibitors and all persons that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss, detention of, or damage to, any dogs or other property, whether arising from accident or other causes whatever, or from any act or omission of themselves, their agents, servants or others and it is on this understanding only that entries are

accepted. No responsibility will be accepted for any products or services advertised or sold at this show. Parents: Parents are reminded that they are responsible for their children at all times and will be held responsible for any damage whatsoever they may cause.
24. PHOTOGRAPHY: All photography, cinematography or television equipment may only be used at the show with permission of the Committee. The committee reserves the right at their absolute discretion to confiscate cameras and or films for infringement of this rule. There is no objection to the general public taking photographs or video film of general views of the Show, providing these are for private use only.

**The following requirements apply to entries for these awards:**

1. Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders Competition Record Book from the Kennel Club or from the show secretary.
2. The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group, or team
3. The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
4. The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to compete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.
5. The Breeder's team must consist of a minimum of three and a maximum of four dogs of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.
6. A Breeder may enter more than one team per show.
7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
8. The 'beaten dog' rule will NOT apply.
9. Best Breeder in Breed and Best Breeder in AVNSC Classes goes through to a Best Breeder in Group award.
10. Breeders acquire points in competition over a calendar year as follows:


Best Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes	3 points
Second place Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes	2 points
Third place Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes	1 point
Best Breeder in Group	4 points
Second place Breeder in Group	3 points
Third place Breeder in Group	2 points
Fourth place Breeder in Group	1 point

The Breeders who have amassed a minimum of 25 points over a calendar year will qualify for the Final/Semi-final in the following year. It is not a requirement to withdraw from the competition upon reaching 25 points. At the end of the competition year in question, Breeders should forward their record books to the Canine Activities Department at the Kennel Club which will advise whether they have qualified for the Crufts Final.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS  
FOR EXHIBITION F (B)**

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these show regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.(a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there. (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these regulations, he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under rule A42.
2. (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show. (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:  
(a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee. (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination & analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by any official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show & the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
